



Administration of Prescription Medications

It is the policy of the Nowata Boys and Girls Club to not administer prescription medications at the Club unless it is determined necessary by the parent and a physician. If it is determined to be necessary the medication must accompany:

- 1. A written Doctors order.
- 2. Written consent from a parent.
- 3. The medication must be brought to the Club in the original prescription bottle properly labeled with a current date by a registered pharmacist as prescribed by law.
- 4. The medication must have been administered at home at least once to reduce the risk of a reaction at school.
- 5. New physician orders and parent permission signatures, and a newly labeled pharmacy container should accompany any changes in type of drugs, dosage and/or time of administration.

It is the policy of the Nowata Boys and Girls Club that inhalers and epipens may be carried on the Teen Club bus with written consent by the parent. Elementary students' inhalers and epipens will be kept in the Youth Club office, however, elementary students may carry inhalers and/or epipens in their back packs on the buses.
